



## CAMBRIDGE NATIONAL SPORTS STUDIES

Our Cambridge National in sports studies enables students to develop and apply knowledge of sports-related activities, with a particular focus on officiating. They explore contemporary issues in sport, different ways of being involved in the sports industry and the impact of sport on wider society. Students will also develop their own performance and how to effectively lead others. Students will complete one externally assessed exam and three coursework units, including written assignments and practical assessments.

### Benefits to the programme:

- Offers the same performance points as a GCSE;
- Recognised by the DfE and can be used as a progression to A level, further education or apprenticeship work;
- Gaining experience in a wide range of transferrable skills, such as: communication, writing, evaluating/analysing, problem solving, the ability to work within a team and working under pressure.
